

Andrea Lindemann Gilliam is an attorney in the Office of the Solicitor, Fair Labor Standards Division at the U.S. Department of Labor. She provides legal advice to the Wage and Hour Division, defends the Department in appellate litigation proceedings, and supports the regional offices in trial litigation. Her work involves minimum wage and overtime issues, child labor standards, and temporary “guestworker” visa programs. The primary focus of her work relates to enforcing labor protections for workers in the U.S. on guestworker visas and providing legal advice regarding certifications for immigration relief for crime victims.

Previously, Ms. Gilliam worked as a policy analyst at the Center for Law and Social Policy, where her work focused on job quality issues that affect low-income workers, including paid leave policies. She also has worked as a senior legal fellow at Polaris Project, where she advocated for state and federal policies to fight human trafficking. Before coming to D.C., Ms. Gilliam worked as an attorney in California at Paul Hastings LLP, where she worked on a wide range of labor and employment issues and served as a volunteer coordinator for the firm’s pro bono program.

Ms. Gilliam received a bachelor's degree from the University of California, Santa Barbara and a J.D. from the University of California, Berkeley School of Law, where she served as the Managing Editor for the *Berkeley Journal of International Law*. During law school, she participated in the California Asylum Representation Clinic.

Ms. Gilliam serves as the Chair of the Board of Directors of Mary's Center, a community health clinic in Washington D.C. and Maryland. She has served as an advisory board member of Restaurant Opportunities Center of Washington, D.C. In 2012, she was awarded the Kerry O’Brien Community Partner of the Year award by the D.C. Employment Justice Center.
